1. True

Clue(s):

Tim: Dad, that's much too early. I'm going out with Simon tonight. We're spending the evening at a nightclub. We're staying there till midnight. I can't meet you until the afternoon. Two o'clock is better.

Man: OK. But don't be late. And have a good evening.

Clue(s):

Clue(s):

Greg: This weekend is so boring. Let's go out and do something tomorrow. I'd like to do some sport. Would you like to play tennis with me?

Sophia: I'm not very good at tennis. My best sport is hockey. I'd like to have a game tomorrow.

Greg: Don't be silly. We can't play hockey with just two people. We could go out on our bikes. So that I can take a picnic.

Sophia: Great idea.

2. B

Clue(s):

Woman: I want some shampoo to take on holiday. The chemist is at the other end of the shopping center. So let's go and look for your swimming costume first.

Girl: Oh, yes. There's a really nice one in the sports shop over there.

Woman: Ok. And remind me to buy something to read on the plane. The bookshop is next to the chemist's.

Clue(s):

Clue(s):

Woman: You know Paula's sixteen soon?

Man: Surely not! Time passes so quickly. Now, let me see, when is her birthday? It's the fifteenth of May, isn't it?

Woman: <u>That's right.</u> It's on a Monday. So the party's two days before, on the thirteenth. That's a Saturday.

Exercise 4: Read and choose the correct sentences. Which questions does the examiner often ask in Phrase 1?

- C. Do you like where you live? Why/Why not?
- F. What subject do you study?

Explanation: Because in Speaking Part 1, the examiner asks you general questions
