Explanation: Entrance is a door, gate, etc. by which you can enter a building or place.

Answer: C. dark

Explanation: Dark clouds are a sign of a rain or storm coming.

3. She is the girl who seemed ill with short brown hair and a _____ complexion.

Answer: D. pale

Explanation: "Being ill means feeling sick or not well". "Pale" is used to describe people's face or skin if it has less colour than usual (for example when they are sick).

Answer: A. digital

Explanation: Digital camera is a type of camera that records images that can be looked at on a computer.

Answer: A. antique

Explanation: If something is antique, it is made in an earlier period and considered to have value.

Answer: in

Explanation: Plug in is to attach electrical equipment to an electricity source with a plug.

Answer: on

Explanation: Turn on is to start the flow of electricity, gas, water, etc. by moving a switch, or button.

Explanation: Turn off is to stop the flow of electricity, gas, water, etc. by moving a switch, or button.
